Children who are seeking enrolment at the service will be given Priority of Access in accordance with the guidelines that have been established by the Federal Government.

Priority of access assessment:

- Priority 1:** a child at risk of serious abuse or neglect
- Priority 2:** a child of a single parent who satisfies, or of parents who both satisfy, the work/training/study test
- under Section 14 of the A New Tax System (Family Assistance) Act 1999 (see notes below)
- Priority 3:** any other child

Additional information (within these priority categories, precedence should also be given to children in):

- Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander families
- Families which include a person with a disability
- Families on lower incomes
- Socially isolated families
- Single parent families

Notes for Priority 2:

An individual is recognised to be in work or work related commitments if they:

- Are in paid work (for at least 15 hours per week)
- Receive a carer payment under Part 2.5 of the Social Security Act 1991, or
- Receive a carer allowance for a disable adult as per section 952 of the Social Security Act 1991
- An individual has recognised training commitments if undertaking a training course (for at least 15 hours per week) for the purpose of improving work skills and/or employment prospects, including during course vacations.

An individual has recognised study commitments if:

- Receiving a youth allowance and undertaking full-time study (at least 15 hours per week)
- Receiving Austudy payment under the Social Security Act 1991
- Receiving a pensioner education supplement under the Social Security Act 1991
- Receiving assistance under the ABSTUDY scheme, or • Undertaking any other education course (for at least 15 hours per week) for the purpose of improving work skills and/or employment prospects, including during course vacations.
